

## 6. CHNEP CITIZEN'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE BYLAWS 2025 UPDATES

In 1995, the estuaries and watersheds of Central and Southwest Florida were recognized to have 'national significance' the CHNEP was accepted into the National Estuary Program. A signing ceremony was held in 2000 to celebrate the completion of the first ever CHNEP *Comprehensive Conservation Management Plan* or CCMP. The Plan uses a 'cooperative decision- making process to address diverse resource management concerns.' The CHNEP is composed of 4 Committees, hundreds of representatives have served on these committees and donated thousands of volunteer hours throughout CHNEP's history. The first CHNEP CCMP (2000) outlined the role of the Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC), whose members 'represent public concerns to the partnership and transfer information back to their local communities.' The CAC provides a mechanism for citizens to communicate with the CHNEP, as well as distribute relevant information back to the public, policymakers, agencies and municipalities and NGOs.

The CAC is representative of the many communities in the 10-county area and works within the region to maintain public support for the CHNEP by not only sharing resources and strategies with CHNEP other members of the partnership, but also by disseminating CHNEP resources within their own communities. The CAC chair is a voting member of the Management Committee. During this meeting CHNEP, Executive Director, Jennifer Hecker will be giving a brief history of the CHNEP Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC). Following the presentation, Councilman Gary Wein will give an overview on the Policy Committee's vision on the role and structure of the CAC. Afterwards, there will be time for CAC discussion.

## 7. CHNEP COMMUNICATION & OUTREACH STRATEGY 2025 UPDATES

The 2025 Update to the Comprehensive Conservation Management Plan (CCMP) was reviewed by the CHNEP Management Conference Committees (including CAC) at meetings throughout 2023-2024. The CAC provided feedback on new science and partner programs, and these were subsequently integrated in the 2025 Update to the CHNEP CCMP. This was approved by EPA and adopted by the Policy Committee September 20, 2024 as CHNEP's guiding document. Several supporting documents which guide implementation of projects listed in the CCMP, including the CHNEP Communications and Outreach Strategy, also require updates to capture the changes made in the 2025 Update.

The Communications and Outreach Strategy specifically addresses how partners are engaging in environmental education outreach and communication within the region. The guiding principle is to equitably distribute CHNEP outreach materials, activities, and grants to all 10 counties; and identify realistic and achievable communications and public engagement projects and activities that can be accomplished to do so. Audiences include all general community members throughout the 10 counties, policy makers, scientists and agency or municipality technical staff, universities, and NGOs.

Nicole Iadevaia, CHNEP Dir. Of Research and Restoration staff will be leading this exercise to review final edits together with those brough by CHNEP staff and CAC members at the August 20<sup>th</sup>, 2025 meeting to gather final input.

- Welcomed new team member- Conservation Specialist, Michelle McGill who will lead on planning and representing CHNEP at outreach event. Held HR and CHNEP onboarding meetings on start date of 9/10. CHNEP updated outreach onboarding and resource documents in preparation.
- Completed annual staff appraisals and held appraisal meetings with all CHNEP staff.
- Sent fall FY26 invoice letters to CHNEP member counties and cities with the appropriate project and informational fact sheets relevant to their community.
- As a follow up to the 2025 Resiliency Summit in September, CHNEP shared the Summit <u>playlist on YouTube</u> and the updated <u>Southwest Florida Resiliency page</u> which now features resources from all past summits, including agendas, speaker biographies, and videos organized by tags for easier public access.

## Finance and Grants Management

- Updated the <u>funding opportunities fact sheet</u> and sent out historic funding opportunities notification to all CHNEP Committees about a number of special large state and federal funding opportunities of interest.
- Prepared and submitted FY25 annual End-of-Year reports for both EPA 320 and EPA IIJA grants.
- Did FDEP final report and reimbursement request, closing out FY25 grant and receiving full \$75,000 payment.
- Finalized edits to Amended FY2026 CHNEP Work Plan & Budget, these were approved by CHNEP Policy Committee at 9/25 meeting.
- FY26 Agreement for annual programmatic support funds from Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) received CHNEP's host board approval with partial execution on 10/28/25. It was then sent to SWFWMD for full execution.

  - o Advertised through NGOs, WGCU radio ads, and other partners leading up to the event. Made social media posts before, during and after event.
  - Sent out personalized invitations to all city and county councils/commissions and managers/administrators, as well as federal and state senators and representatives.
  - Coordinated with Blue Arc Engineering, Inc. to provide Continuing Education Hours (CEHs) to professional engineers and geologists who attended the Summit. CHNEP created and filled out certificates for each of the attendees who signed up to earn CEHs and sent certificates out to those

- individuals to self-report their hours to the Florida Board of Professional Engineers or Florida Board of Professional Geologists.

- Provided educational content at a booth at the Miakka Hootenanny in Sarasota County, FL. Over 50 kids and adults stopped by the booth to play games and learn about different fish species adapted for different environments, how to properly measure a fish, and how objects can break down into microplastics.
- Designed new educational activity involving sorting different types of everyday items into the types of microplastics they break down into to be used at future outreach events. Microplastics are a common water quality pollutant in the CHNEP area based on prior CHNEP microplastic sampling, so working to enhance education on the topic to advance our CCMP goal to improve water quality.
- Provided CHNEP educational materials, including estuary and seagrass informational posters, to Gasparilla Island State Park staff to be placed in their parking lot of the park for interpretive purposes.
- Edited and finalized CHNEP 2026 Nature Calendar design with designer. Met with printer to review scope of the project. Reviewed and approved electronic and hard-copy proofs in advance of printing and mailing.
